Confession of Sin

B.C.P. p. 79

Officiant: Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Officiant & People: **Most merciful God,
we confess that we have sinned against you
in thought, word, and deed,
by what we have done,
and by what we have left undone.
We have not loved you with our whole heart;
we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.
We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.
For the sake of your son Jesus Christ,
have mercy on us and forgive us;
that we may delight in your will,
and walk in your ways,
to the Glory of your Name. Amen.**

Officiant: Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. Amen.

The First Lesson:

A lesson from the book of Job

Job 11:1-9,13-20

Zophar Speaks: Job's Guilt Deserves Punishment

11 Then Zophar the Naamathite answered:

2 “Should a multitude of words go unanswered,
and should one full of talk be vindicated?

3 Should your babble put others to silence,
and when you mock, shall no one shame you?

4 For you say, ‘My conduct is pure,
and I am clean in God’s sight.’

5 But O that God would speak,
and open his lips to you,

6 and that he would tell you the secrets of wisdom!
For wisdom is many-sided.

Know then that God exacts of you less than your guilt deserves.

7 “Can you find out the deep things of God?
Can you find out the limit of the Almighty?

8 It is higher than heaven—what can you do?
Deeper than Sheol—what can you know?

9 Its measure is longer than the earth,
and broader than the sea.

13 “If you direct your heart rightly,
you will stretch out your hands toward him.

14 If iniquity is in your hand, put it far away,
and do not let wickedness reside in your tents.

15 Surely then you will lift up your face without blemish;
you will be secure, and will not fear.

16 You will forget your misery;
you will remember it as waters that have passed away.

17 And your life will be brighter than the noonday;
its darkness will be like the morning.

18 And you will have confidence, because there is hope;
you will be protected and take your rest in safety.

19 You will lie down, and no one will make you afraid;
many will entreat your favor.

20 But the eyes of the wicked will fail;
all way of escape will be lost to them,
and their hope is to breathe their last.”

A lesson from the book of Revelation

Revelation 5:1-14

The Scroll and the Lamb

5 Then I saw in the right hand of the one seated on the throne a scroll written on the inside and on the back, sealed with seven seals; **2** and I saw a mighty angel proclaiming with a loud voice, “Who is worthy to open the scroll and break its seals?” **3** And no one in heaven or on earth or under the earth was able to open the scroll or to look into it. **4** And I began to weep bitterly because no one was found worthy to open the scroll or to look into it. **5** Then one of the elders said to me, “Do not weep. See, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has conquered, so that he can open the scroll and its seven seals.”

A lesson from the Gospel according to Saint Matthew

Matthew 5:1-12

The Beatitudes

5 When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. **2** Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying:

3 “Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

4 “Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.

5 “Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.

6 “Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.

7 “Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy.

8 “Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.

9 “Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.

10 “Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness’ sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

11 “Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. **12** Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

Almighty God, who created us in your own image: Grant us grace fearlessly to contend against evil and to make no peace with oppression; and, that we may reverently use our

freedom, help us to employ it in the maintenance of justice in our communities and among the nations, to the glory of your holy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**
